

William (Billy) Raymond Chase 1936-2021

William (Billy) Raymond Chase, 85, passed away on Monday, September 13 in Webster, Texas. Billy was born on June 25,1936 in Norfolk, Virginia to William Edward Chase and Louise Merwarth.
